

AN INTRODUCTION TO TRUSTS

Tuesday, 14th and Wednesday, 15th September 2010 in Basel

This annual 2 day training course will be held in Basel in a similar format to previous years in Basel, Zurich, Geneva and Lugano. The course is designed to provide practical instruction for persons working in the banking, financial, trust and fiduciary sectors in Switzerland. It will be of interest to people with relatively little experience of trusts, who wish to gain a more comprehensive knowledge of the subject.

The course will be delivered by experienced STEP members who will concentrate on the practical aspects of trust formation and administration. Comprehensive documentation will be supplied and there will be plenty of opportunity for participants to interact. The language of the course will be English but questions and answers may also be in German.
